Delta Announces All Jet Service to Central Wisconsin Airport starting September 8, 2011
for immediate release

(Mosinee, WI) – Delta Air Lines’ fall flight schedule to and from Central Wisconsin Airport (CWA) will feature all jet service as Delta moves to eliminate their Saab 340 propeller aircraft from their fleet. The new service will begin September 8, 2011 with three flights daily to Minneapolis/St. Paul (MSP), and three flights daily to Detroit (DTW).

The switch from 34-seat Saab 340 propeller aircraft to 50-seat Canadair regional jets will constitute a 6% increase in seats from CWA. Jet service will provide shorter flight durations to both MSP and DTW, and increased seat capacity per flight.

The removal of the propeller aircraft from the flight schedule will provide for all jet service to and from CWA, as both United and American Airlines only use jets to service CWA.

The Central Wisconsin Airport (CWA) is a regional non-hub airport located in Mosinee, WI, roughly equidistant between Stevens Point and Wausau. The airport is owned by Portage and Marathon Counties and is governed by the Central Wisconsin Joint Airport Board. It is currently served by three airlines: Delta, United and American. These carriers serve the hubs of Minneapolis/St. Paul, Detroit, and Chicago O'Hare with 12 daily flights from Central Wisconsin.
