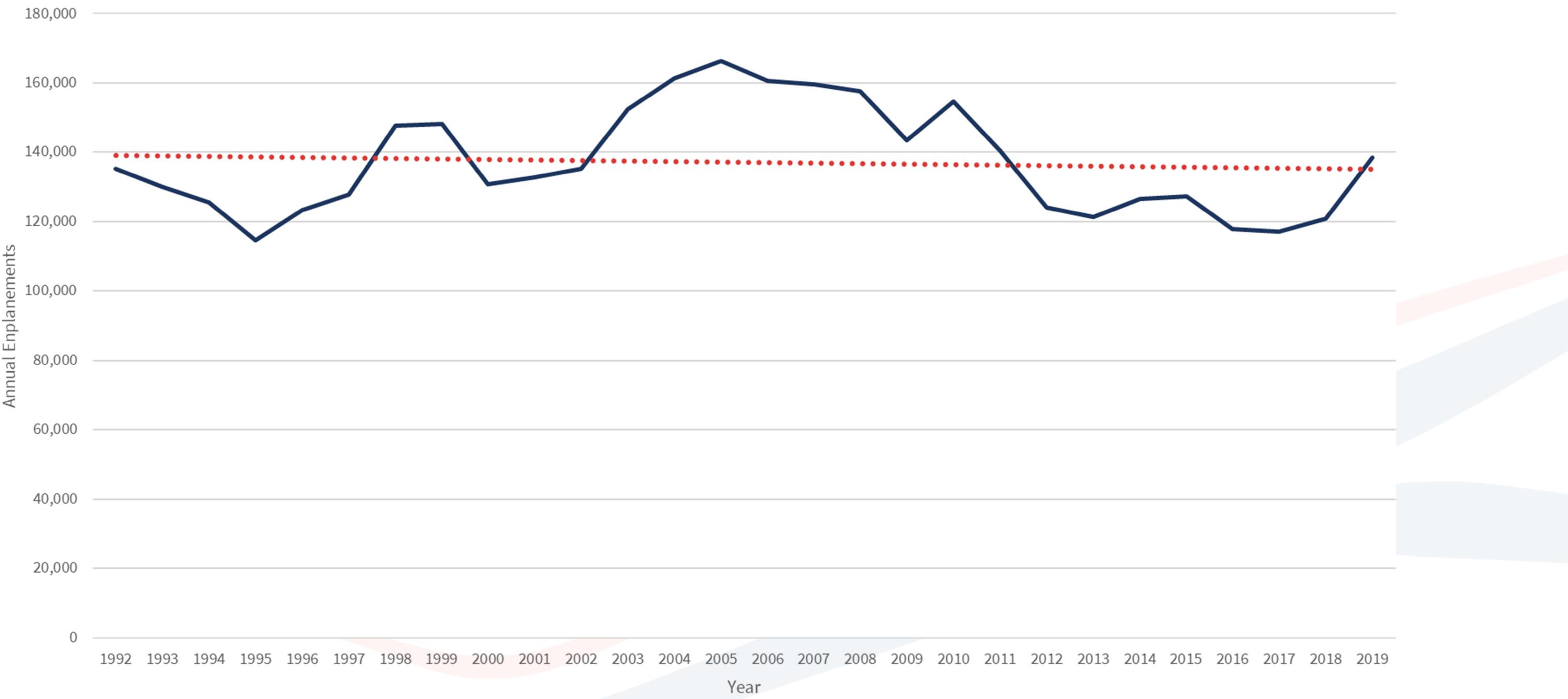

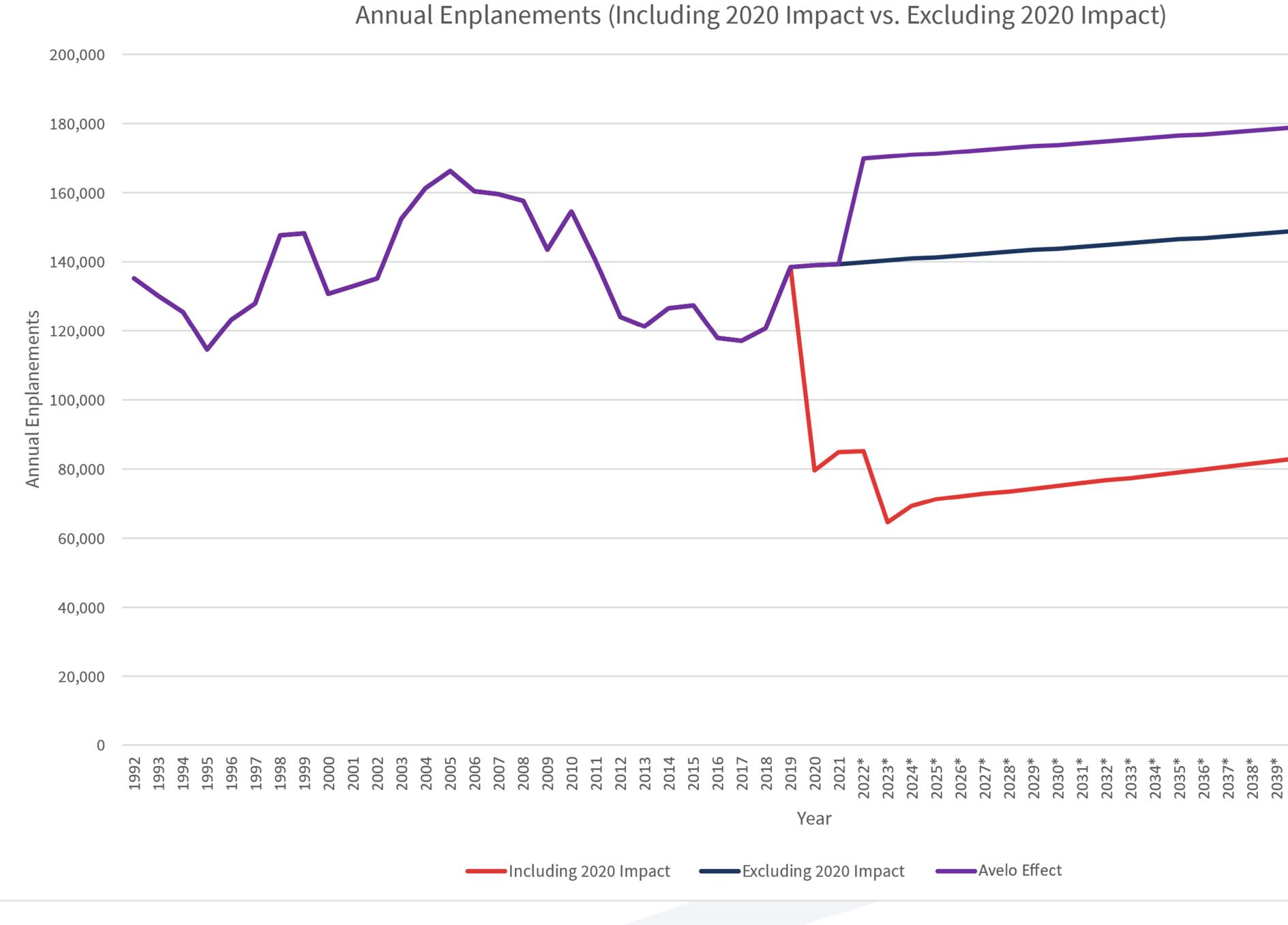


Passenger Terminal Enplanements

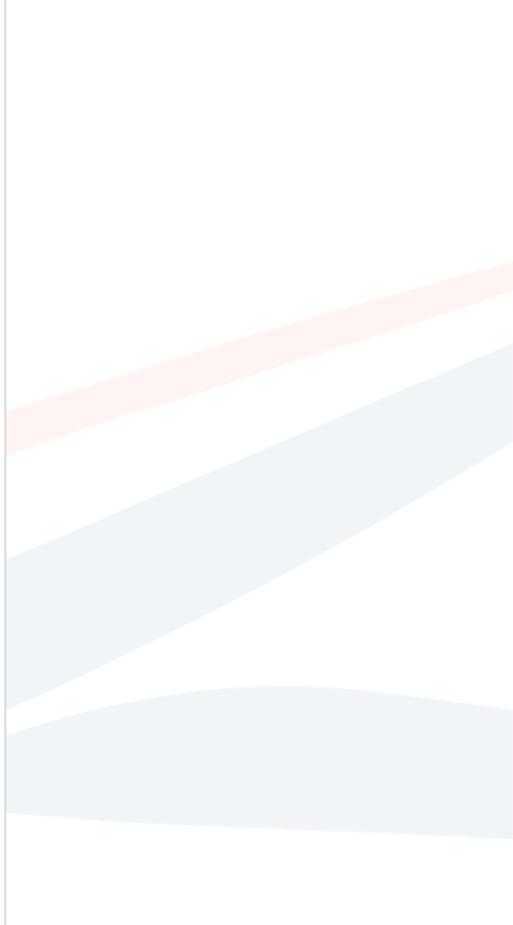


Historic Annual Enplanements (1992 - 2019)

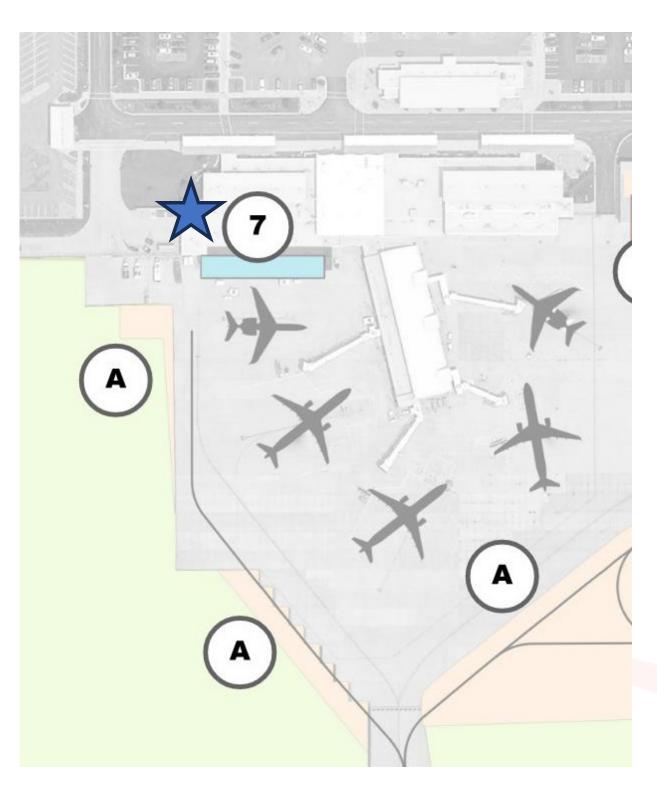

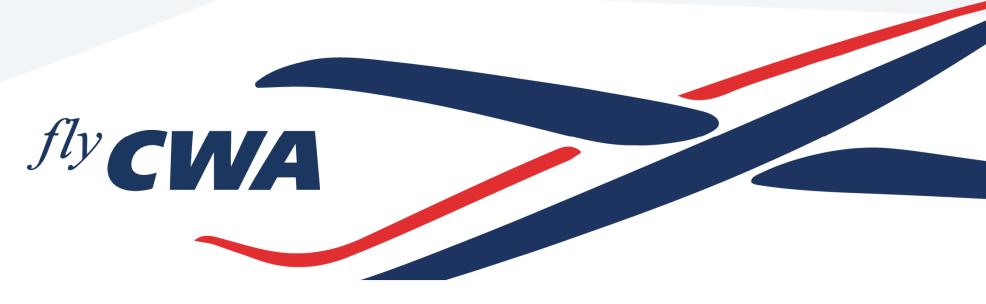

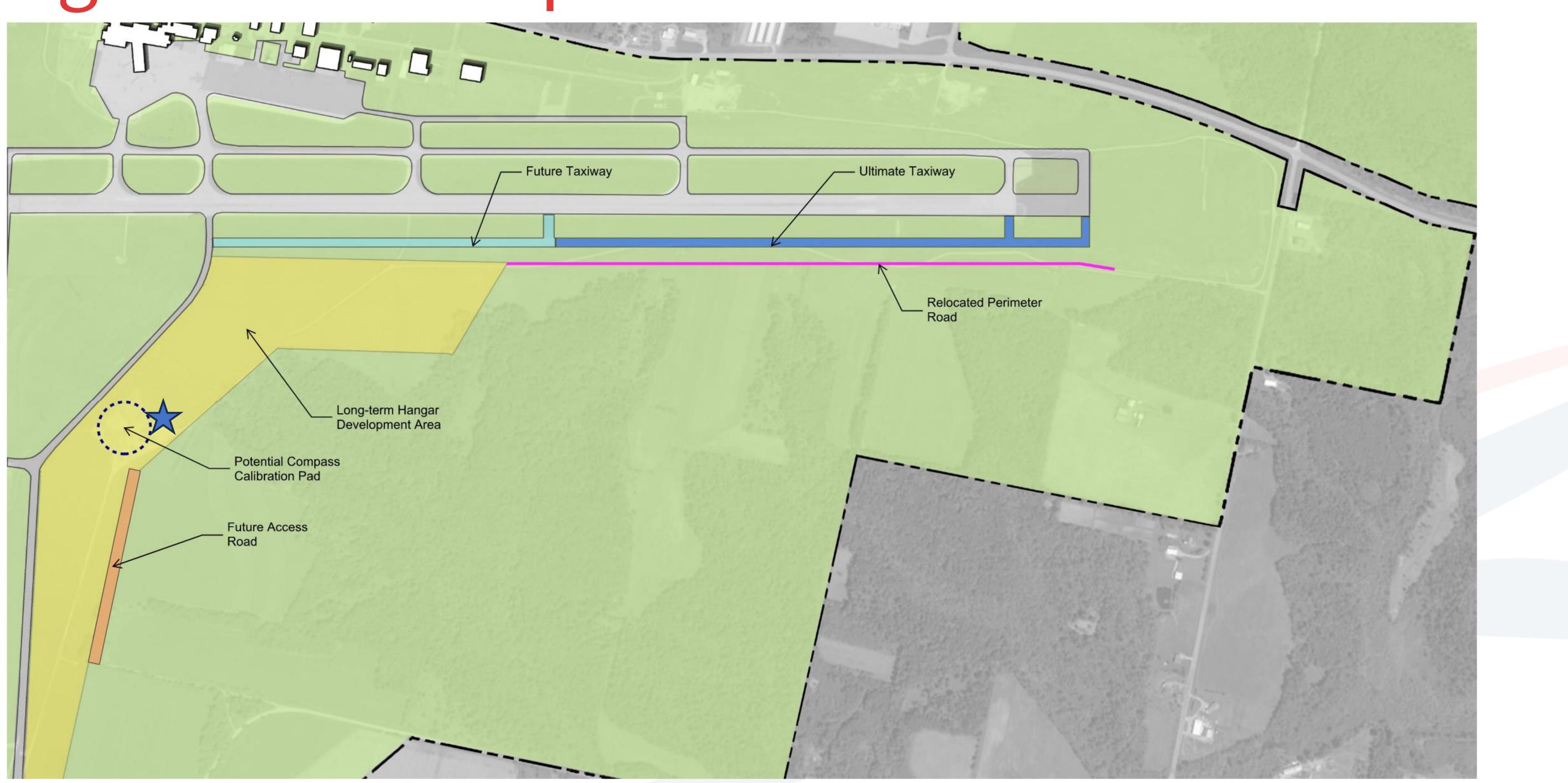
